

Polling Methodological note – 19/02/2016



TNS Omnibus interviewed a representative sample of 1,120 adults in Great Britain between the 11th and 15th February 2016. All interviews were conducted as online self-completion. The TNS Omnibus uses the Lightspeed GMI access panel as its sample source.

The data was weighted to match population totals for age, sex, working status, 2015 General Election voting patterns, region and likelihood to vote in the next General Election. Further details on the weighting are given below.

EU referendum

The EU referendum figures provided aim to show the current political opinion of the nation rather than to accurately predict the outcome of the referendum.

The topline results exclude respondents who told us they would not vote in the referendum, the sample size for the voting intention figure is 1,079.

The EU referendum figures are estimates based on a sample of the population of Great Britain; this means that there is a degree of uncertainty around each figure. On the assumption that the sample is equivalent to a representative random sample, the voting intention figures have a margin of error of up to ± 3 percentage points. As a result, the true value of support for “Remain” or “Leave” could be up to 3 percentage points lower or three percentage points higher than those quoted. This uncertainty means that it is important that each individual poll is not viewed in isolation.

Weighting

Weights have been applied to the sample to ensure that it is representative of the general public in Great Britain aged 18+. The sources for the population totals are provided in each table.
